- Money App earn points for completing tasks and offering your opinion on surveys. Trade the points for cash through PayPal.

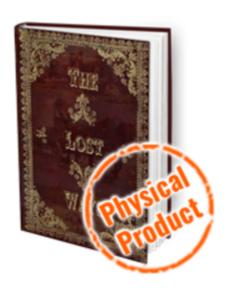
General Tips for Your Side Hustle
