1. 15 Items That Should Be In Your Vehicle During the Winter

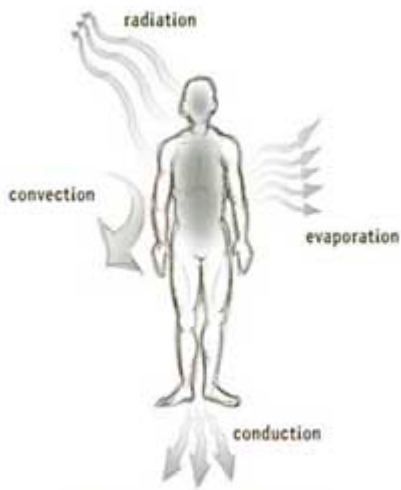

HOW THE BODY LOSES HEAT
