

Is Black America Now Anti-Liberal?

victim of bullying. This woman allegedly asked her to stop her campaign, warning her that if she didn't, "everything was going to fall apart."

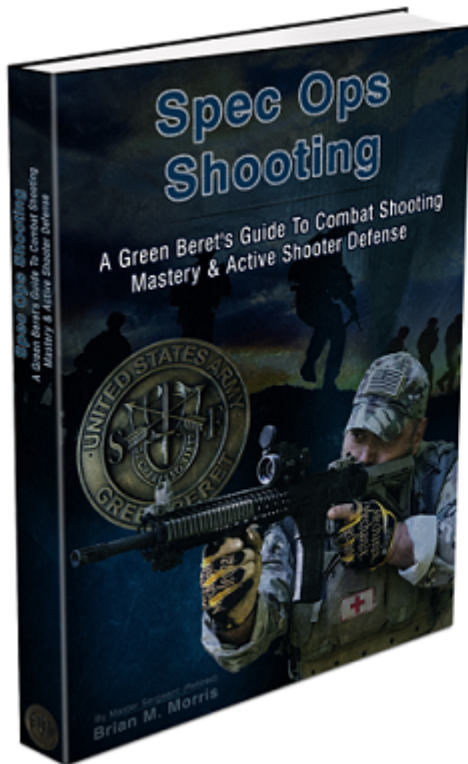
